Women of Trinity is a ministry that enables our parish to offer additional ministries that touch the lives of both parishioners and those who are, as of yet, beyond our walls. They work quietly in the background making the love of Christ known. Over the years they have helped support the work of a variety of ministries in our community that touch lives. They have been involved with helping girls at East Texas Open Door. Women of Trinity have been involved with From Bondage to Freedom. They have also partnered with the Men of Trinity in the past in helping raise money for the parish's security system. Recently, they donated a substantial amount to help cover the cost for the restoration of our stain glass windows in the church.

There may have been a misconception in the past that this ministry was only open to some of the women of the parish. This is not true. All women of the parish are invited to be part of Women of Trinity. The Women of Trinity meet from September through May in the Guild Room the third Wednesday of the month at 11:00 AM. Each month they have a unique program of interest with a speaker followed by a luncheon at 12:00 PM in All Saints' Hall. This is a good time to mark your calendars and make it a point to become a part of this wonderful ministry to our parish. Rector's Meanderings

Dear Beloved in Christ:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ.

In today's society we have seen the birth of the new age movement. Polls over the last several decades have continually shown the Christian faith as being less relevant in people's lives. Truth be told, this isn't really new. Each generation seems to go through a phase such as this as they come to recognize their own mortality. People ask the eternal questions, "What am I here for?" "Why was I born, just to die?" These can indeed be frightful questions. People search for meaning in their lives. Sadly the secular culture offers little when it comes to a person's eternal soul. If the Church is going to seek to provide answers to those questions, then the answers must not be a reflection of the culture. Rather the answers need to reflect the ability for a person to be in relationship with their creator. The answers people seek through the culture pulls them in all sorts of directions. Why aren't more pulled toward the Church, towards Jesus Christ?

Paul writes in **Ephesians 2:10** "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works. Which God prepared in advance for us to do." Why don't more people know we are created by God and for God and one another? Very simply the Church has done a poor job of proclaiming the Gospel in love. It has been proclaimed by the state in the past when church has been an arm of government. It has often been proclaimed as a set of rules a person must follow. It has been proclaimed as a country club of fellow travels in which sinners need to clean up their act before the walk through the doors. But, sadly, it hasn't been proclaimed as the answer to the questions and hurts one's heart endures throughout life.

We were made for God; He created us to be in fellowship with Him. He does indeed have a plan for our lives that will leave us happy and fulfilled. We need to be aware of that plan. However, to be aware of it, we have to know the author of it.

Turning our lives over to the Lord can be frightening; He may ask us to do something difficult. I can promise you, He will ask you do something difficult, uncomfortable, outside the comfort zone. He will place you where you need to be in relationship with Him rather than where you are comfortable. A person need not be afraid of that. Rather a person should welcome it for in putting a person where he or she needs to be, He assures us that He is with us, we are not on the road alone and he will not abandon nor forsake an individual who has turned to Him.

We are to be in relationship with Christ, with God. In the fullness of that relationship we will feel compelled to be and do what Christ has called us to. We will be salt and light to the world, and we will go into all nations baptizing in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Those are the works that our Father has prepared for us in advance. Preach and teach His word though our lives, through our actions, and most of all through our giving unconditional love.
